- d) What are one or two notable lessons we can learn from the book for use today?
- e) Summarize the tests of faith Daniel and his friends encountered. Summarize the tests of faith Christians today encounter.
- f) Summarize Daniel's "Great Statue" vision and its fulfillment.
- B. Answer the same a) thru d) questions for the book of Ezekiel. In addition:
 - e) What events in the book of Ezekiel happened before the fall of Jerusalem versus after?
 - f) What is "premillinealism"? How popular is it among Protestants? Is it true according to the Bible?
