- G. What lesson(s) can we learn from the book for use today?
- Bonus #1: Where is the Chebar River (Ezek. 1:1)?
- Bonus #2: Which events in Ezekiel occurred before the destruction of Jerusalem in 586 B.C. versus after?

Bonus #3: Some people use Ezekiel 40-48 along with the Book of Revelation and other passages to teach Jesus' second coming will include establishing a physical kingdom centered in Jerusalem, restoring the Jews as an international power, rebuilding the temple, and restoring animal sacrifices in the temple. Can you determine what name is commonly used to describe this teaching and offer two arguments against it?
